FSM graduates will:

1. Identify, analyze and justify appropriate ethical and legal choices in the treatment of individual patients and their families.	<b>Ethics and the Law</b>
2. Identify, analyze and justify ethical issues in the healthcare systems in which they work, including issues of access to care and conflicts of interest.	<b>Ethics and Systems</b>
3. Behave with honesty, integrity, respect, and compassion toward all patients, families, students, faculty, and members of the healthcare team.	<b>Professional Behavior</b>
4. Treat all patients equally, regardless of gender, race, religion, socioeconomic status, disability, sexual orientation or ability to pay.	<b>Equity</b>
