

Resilience Challenge Lessons

On June 17, your Medical Alumni Association (MAA) hosted an inspiring virtual event featuring Judy Moskowitz, PhD, MPH, professor and vice chair for Scientific and Faculty Development in the Department of Medical Social Sciences at Feinberg.

Dr. Moskowitz shared insights from her partnership with National Public Radio (NPR) on the Resilience Challenge, a positive emotion skills program offered as part of NPR's *Stress Less* series. The program attracted over 11,000 volunteers and focused on building mental resilience through evidence-based strategies. She also discussed her ongoing research on how cultivating positive emotions can reduce stress, improve emotional well-being, and support better health outcomes.

Attendees gained valuable insights into how positive emotions can help manage stress and learned practical strategies to apply in their daily lives.

Northwestern Launches First-of-Its-Kind Prosthetics & Orthotics Research Master's Program



Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine is proud to announce the launch of the <u>Master of Prosthetics & Orthotics</u> <u>Research (MPO-R) program</u>—the first program of its kind in the US. Combining rigorous clinical training with advanced research education, MPO-R prepares the next generation of clinicianscientists to lead innovation in prosthetics and orthotics.

Launched in 2024 through the Northwestern University Prosthetics-Orthotics Center (NUPOC), the selective nine-session program builds on the established MPO curriculum by adding researchfocused coursework and a thesis-driven capstone project. Students gain immersive experience in clinical care, biomechanics, statistics, scientific writing, rehabilitation research, and more.

From the South Side to Streeterville: The Creation of the Chicago Campus | Hybrid

Available Now In-Person and Online

One hundred years ago, on May 8, 1925, Northwestern administrators, students, and major donors gathered to break ground on a new campus in the up-and-coming Streeterville neighborhood. This campus would bring together Northwestern's medical, dental, law, and business schools for the first time, fulfilling a vision nearly 20 years in the making. Those 20 years had seen many changes in medicine and medical education, and the planned Ward Memorial Building, home of Northwestern University Medical School (the future Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine), would allow Northwestern to remain at the forefront of medical education, research, and care.

Now on display in the Eckenhoff Reading Room, From the South Side to Streeterville: The Creation of the Chicago Campus uses items from Galter's archival, artifact, and book collections to explore the story of the medical school's move to Streeterville.
