

Saddam Hussein following his 2003 capture. He currently practices emergency medicine at



Medical Center Hospital in West Texas, the highest-level trauma center across 38,000 square miles, and continues to drive systemic improvements in healthcare delivery. Dr. Bose also is the subject of the gripping documentary Desert Doc on Prime Video. Mitchell D. Creinin '86, '88 MD, was recently named the recipient of the Society of Family Planning Lifetime Achievement Award. Dr. Creinin is professor and director of the Complex Family Planning Fellowship at the University of California, Davis. Dr. Creinin also is a past president of the Society of Family Planning.

has raised \$206,333 and ridden 16,868 miles in

Conducted in partnership with researchers at the University of Texas, the study followed 460 Medicare patients across four key stages of treatment, from diagnosis through endof-life care, and highlighted the need for more proactive and equitable care. Dr. Terry recently shared her findings in the Texas Oncology Newsletter, The Beacon, in a feature titled "Unequal Journeys: New Study Reveals Gaps in End-of-Life Care for Metastatic Breast Cancer



From the South Side to Streeterville: The Creation of the Chicago Campus | Hybrid

Now Available In Person and Online

One hundred years ago, on May 8, 1925, Northwestern administrators, students, and major donors gathered to break ground on a new campus in the up-and-coming Streeterville neighborhood. This campus would bring together Northwestern's medical, dental, law, and business schools for the first time, fulfilling a vision nearly 20 years in the making. Those 20 years had seen many changes in medicine and medical education, and the planned Ward Memorial Building, home of Northwestern University Medical School (the future Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine), would allow Northwestern to remain at the forefront of medical education, research, and care.

Now on display in the Eckenhoff Reading Room, From the South Side to Streeterville: The Creation of the Chicago Campus uses items from Galter Health Sciences Library's archival, artifact, and book collections to explore the story of the medical school's move to Streeterville, including its former locations, the decision to move, the changing landscape of science and medical education, and the financial campaigns that raised millions to create the Chicago campus.
