<b>Abnormal uterine bleeding</b>	Evaluate and/or manage a patient with abnormal uterine bleeding	Active participant
<b>Adnexal mass</b>	Evaluate a patient presenting with an adnexal mass	Active participant
<b>Adnexal surgery</b>	Participate in adnexal surgery (ovarian cystectomy, oophorectomy, ovarian torsion, sterilization, ectopic pregnancy, etc) including at the time of hysterectomy	Active participant
<b>Bleeding in pregnancy or postpartum</b>	Evaluate a patient complaining of bleeding in any trimester of pregnancy and immediately after delivery (post-partum hemorrhage)	Observation
<b>Cervical dysplasia screening and management</b>	Evaluate a patient at risk for cervical dysplasia. This includes discussion of when to screen, reviewing abnormal Pap smear or HR HPV results, colposcopy, LEEP, cold knife conization	Active participant
<b>Cesarean delivery</b>	Assist with a cesarean delivery	Active participant
<b>Contraception counseling and/or management</b>	Counsel a patient regarding contraceptive options and/or participate in contraceptive procedures (i.e. LARC insertion)	Observation
<b>Gynecologic malignancy (e.g., (cervical, uterine, ovarian, vulvar, etc.)</b>	Evaluate a patient with symptoms of, and/or risk factors for gynecologic malignancy or manage a patient with a gynecologic malignancy	Active participant
<b>Fundal height and fetal heart tones</b>	Measure the fundal height of the gravid uterus and use a doppler to detect fetal heart rate	Active participant
<b>Hypertensive disorders of pregnancy</b>	Evaluate a patient with elevated blood pressures in pregnancy	Active participant
<b>Infertility Evaluation or Management</b>	Evaluate a patient with fertility concerns (e.g., infertility, sub-fertility, oocyte cryopreservation, etc.)	Observation
<b>Interpret a fetal heart rate tracing</b>	review a fetal heart rate tracing (NST or labor tracing) and interpret it	Active participant
<b>Intrapartum Care (laboring patient)</b>	Participate in the care of a laboring patient	Active participant
<b>Menopause &amp; Perimenopause</b>	Evaluate a patient during or after the menopause transition for age-appropriate screening, symptoms and/or sequelae of menopause (dyspareunia, osteoporosis, etc.)	Active participant
<b>Pap smear and cervical cultures</b>	obtain cervical sampling for cancer screening (Pap smear, primary HPV screening) and cervical samples for PCR testing of gonorrhea and chlamydia	Active participant
<b>Pelvic Examination (speculum and bimanual)</b>	Perform a speculum exam, visualize the cervix, perform bimanual examination	Active participant
<b>Pelvic floor disorders (urinary incontinence, pelvic organ prolapse)</b>	Evaluate a patient for symptoms of urinary dysfunction, incontinence or pelvic organ prolapse	Active participant

<b>Pelvic pain</b>	Evaluate and/or manage a patient with complaint of pelvic pain, dysmenorrhea, diagnosis of endometriosis, adenomyosis, or myofascial disorder	Active participant
<b>Perineal laceration repair</b>	participate in and/or observe a perineal laceration repair after vaginal delivery	Observation
<b>Post-operative assessment</b>	perform an assessment of a patient following surgery (immediate post-op check, inpatient rounding, post-operative outpatient visit) including both OB and GYN patients	Active participant
<b>Postpartum care</b>	Evaluate a postpartum patient (eg. assess for immediate postpartum complications, usual care, and 3-12 weeks postpartum care)	Active participant
<b>Peripartum mood disorders</b>	Screen a pregnant or postpartum patient for symptoms of depression and/or anxiety	Active participant
<b>Preconception care</b>	Evaluate a patient contemplating future pregnancy and make appropriate recommendations	Active participant
<b>Pregnancy of unknown location</b>	Evaluate a patient with an unconfirmed intrauterine pregnancy (identify appropriate next steps/tests to be ordered)	Observation
<b>Prenatal care</b>	Provide routine prenatal care throughout the trimesters	Active participant
<b>Prenatal genetic Testing/Screening</b>	Review options for, or results of, genetic testing/screening (e.g., discussion of aneuploidy screening, carrier screening and procedures involved)	Active participant
<b>Preterm contractions and/or premature rupture of membranes</b>	Evaluate a pregnant patient with symptoms concerning for premature rupture of membranes or preterm labor	Observation
<b>Reproductive choice counseling</b>	Evaluate a patient with unintended pregnancy and counsel about options as appropriate	Observation
<b>Sexual health assessment</b>	Evaluate a patient's sexual history, including risks for infection and sexual function/dysfunction	Active participant
<b>Sexually transmitted infections (STI screening, diagnosis, PID)</b>	Counsel a patient regarding options for STI testing/screening or perform STI testing/screening	Active participant
<b>Suturing and knot-tying</b>	Suture and tie surgical knots with appropriate supervision (fascia, incision, port site, hysterotomy, etc.)	Active participant
<b>Ultrasound</b>	Perform a transabdominal ultrasound (GYN or OB), observe transvaginal ultrasound	Observation (real patient); Active Participant (simulated patient)
<b>Uterine surgery</b>	Participate in-surgery on the uterus (hysterectomy, myomectomy, hysteroscopy)	Observation
<b>Vaginal delivery</b>	Assist with a vaginal delivery (spontaneous or operative)	Active participant
<b>Vulvar or vaginal disorder</b>	Evaluate a patient with vulvar or vaginal complaints such as pruritis, discharge, irritation, lesions (eg. (vaginitis, dermatoses, dermatitis, dysplasia, cancer)	Active participant
