

Design for Digital Health Reading Course

The <u>Center for Behavioral Intervention Technologies (CBITs)</u> is hosting a new Design for Digital Health Reading Course, starting January 14, 2021. The course will run for 8 sessions, every other week.

This reading course will provide an introduction to designing digital health technologies. It is intended for clinical scientists who are developing and studying digital health technologies. The course will teach about the user-centered design process, focusing on methods and techniques that can be leveraged. They will use peer-reviewed journal articles and conference proceedings to provide instruction in these areas.
