

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
### **Our Impact**



Jennifer Chan, MD and Sarah Welch, MPH, have been awarded two grants, one from the Peterson Foundation and the other from the NU Institute for Global Health. These funds support further study of Dr. Chan's previous research on human mobility data during the COVID-19 pandemic. She and Sarah Welch, along with a graduate student at Harvard University, will use the resulting qualitative findings to improve the usability and value of human mobility data for continued use during the pandemic and for humanitarians to use in disaster response.
